Getting Through the Holidays

I remember the holidays of 1996, my first holiday season following the loss of Jonathan, as if it were just last year. As we entered into the month of November, the song, "Give Thanks" seemed to ring in my ears continuously. It was played on the Christian radio station, sung at church, and seemingly hummed by strangers everywhere I went.

The tune begins with the words, "Give thanks with a grateful heart...". A *grateful* heart? In my sad state of mind, I honestly could not think of a single thing for which I was grateful. I was *glad* I had a loving husband and a beautiful four-year-old son, but my deep sorrow blurred my perspective of how much I truly had been given, despite what I had lost.

The song continues with, "...give thanks to the Holy One..." Oh, now that was a very touchy subject with me. Again, my grief-stricken heart and mind could not thank God for anything. In my confusion, I felt He had betrayed me a few months earlier by taking my little Jonathan to heaven, and I was still not talking to Him much, let alone thanking Him.

The first stanza of the song concludes with, "...give thanks for He has given Jesus Christ, His Son." That last part is a prelude into celebrating the birth of Jesus: Christmas. Yes, I knew I was supposed to be rejoicing the birth of my Savior, but during this time of year He is pictured as a baby, not our Almighty Redeemer. The church Christmas cantata nearly killed me. Seeing someone else's baby boy playing the Messiah as an infant was more than I could take. I convinced myself that Jonathan was the director's first choice, but because he died, they had to go with the alternate.

It makes me sad when I think back to those months 12 years ago. My perspective of life and the true meaning of each holiday were skewed by anger, bitterness and sorrow. I approached Thanksgiving and Christmas with a sarcastic atti-

tude that I am ashamed of today. Was I justified for my negativity? Yes. But I don't like to revisit those days in my mind very often. I wondered then if I would or could ever rise above the deep, dark pit I was in. And honestly, I wasn't sure if I really wanted to.

After months of grieving and sorting through my emotions, I finally emerged from the black hole that had imprisoned me for so long. When the holidays rolled around the next year, certainly I was sad, but I was able to enter the season with a fresh outlook. I was ready to resume our holiday schedule and plan where we would spend each special day. I could joyfully shop for family members and friends, and I could once again sing, "Give Thanks" and truly mean each and every word.

If a dark abyss is where you find yourself this year, hold on. You will not be there forever, I promise! The darkness eventually fades. I assure you one day you will see light again. Does that mean you've gone on and left your baby behind? No. It means your broken heart has begun to heal enough to start moving forward with your life. Your baby will be with you in your heart forever. No amount of healing can ever change that, so don't be afraid to move on. Take comfort in knowing that your precious baby, whom you so desperately miss, is with the Holy One. Remember that some day soon you'll be able to gratefully thank Him for the assurance we have of joining our babies for eternity because of the birth of His Son. ♥

I'm here to announce a great and joyful event that is meant for everybody, worldwide: 11 A Savior has just been born in David's town, a Savior who is Messiah and Master. 12 This is what you're to look for: a baby wrapped in a blanket and lying in a manger." 13 At once the angel was joined by a huge angelic choir singing God's praises: 14 Glory to God in the heavenly heights, Peace to all men and women on earth who please him. 15 As the angel choir withdrew into heaven, the sheepherders talked it over. "Let's get over to Bethlehem as fast as we can and see for ourselves what God has revealed to us." 16 They left, running, and found Mary and Joseph, and the baby lying in the manger. 17 Seeing was believing. They told everyone they met what the angels had said about this child. 18 All who heard the sheepherders were impressed. 19 Mary kept all these things to herself, holding them dear, deep within herself. 20 The sheepherders returned and let loose, glorifying and praising God for everything they had heard and seen. It turned out exactly the way they'd been told!
